## - Club Service -Vision & Hearing Screening March 25


Seven Lions (good turnout!) performed vision & hearing screening at St Mark Catholic School in Vienna; we received thank-you's from school nurse & office.

We tested vision of 80 students, and hearing of 76 students (K/1/3/5/8 grades). Four students were referred for vision followup, and 10 for hearing followup. (See also note on page 23 of this newsletter.)

#### Update - Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center Northern VA (LERC NOVA) By Lion Marty Lockard

Lion Marty visited the Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center (LERC NOVA), March 22, to pick up reading glasses for the Lamb Center's homeless Guests. He received 300 pair of glasses which he took to the Lamb Center. Since starting this effort, LERC has supported the Lamb Center's needs to the tune of about 800 pairs of glasses each year. This was

Marty's first visit to the new LERC location in the Mason District Government Center, 6507 Columbia Pike. It's a Falls Church address but is physically located about a mile north of Annandale. The County provides the space at no cost.



There is a large meeting

area where volunteers work. The equipment and glasses in various stages of processing are stored in a dedicated storage room off the meeting area. Pam Martinov, the Bailey's Crossroads Lion that manages LERC, has a small office, also off the meeting area. In addition, the LERC has purchased a new or fairly new, large (20' x 8') and very nice/well-organized

trailer parked in the parking lot. Glasses that have been processed and boxed are stored there until





 typically on medical mission trips. The new LERC location is very practical, efficient, and much nicer than the old location in Arlington.
About a dozen volunteers

(mostly or all Lions) were there working. Before COVID, our club had 4 or 5 regulars who worked at LERC one morning every other week. They usually drove there in one car and finished in time to go out to lunch – usually Olive Garden. It was always a fun time working and socializing together. This Fairfax Lions team worked on



machines that determined the prescription for every donated pair of glasses followed by writing the prescription on a special bag and placing the glasses in the bag. The bags were later sorted and placed in boxes of 50 by other volunteers. If

There were plenty of machines available to use on two separate days during the last week. <u>This can be a wonderful service project</u> - one fully aligned with Lions core mission of serving the vision impaired.






### **Board Meeting - March 25th**

The Board considered a Boy Scout's request to work with FHLC for an Eagle Scout project. Project possibilities might include: collecting eyeglasses for the recycling center, or running a food drive for Food for Others. 1VP Cory Green offered to take the lead, contact the Scout, define a project for him, and monitor it to completion.

The Board discussed potential Club 75th anniversary service projects appropriate for such a Club anniversary, and agreed to present projects for membership input - and a Board decision - at the next club dinner meeting (on

April 1). Based on early assessments, possible special service projects include a major donation to either:

- Enhance clinical space and meet growing patient needs at the <u>INOVA Lions Eye Clinic</u>, which has empowered vision services for the underserved since 1974, or
- (2) Improve facilities and operations of <u>The</u> <u>Lamb Center</u>.

Both are highly worthy service projects, aligned with Lions Clubs core missions.

Due to increased costs of social events in December, at the Chantilly Country Club, the Board agreed to explore holding the December 14, 2025, Holiday Party at the American Legion if space and an appropriate menu is available for a reasonable cost.

The Board approved locking in our 75th Anniversary Charter Night celebration on March 21, 2026 at the Chantilly Country Club, with a "plated" dinner. The planning team will pursue inviting a noted LCI official as a special guest.

#### **ISCC Meeting - March 5th**

Fairfax Lions Club opened the ISCC discussion on how local service clubs promote their clubs and activities. We talked about:

• Having a functional e-newsletter, webpage, Instagram, and Facebook pages;

• Using MAILCHIMP to email customers info on fruit sales;

• Handing out promotional information cards at public events (like July 4th and Fall Festival);

• Using internet resources like Fairfax Times/ Connection Golden Gazette/Central FX-Chamberof-Commerce to advertise events.

• How Lion Tom Comi publishes ads in "Vienna Voice" - the Town's official newsletter mailed each month to homes and businesses throughout the community.

We have opinions, but don't have data, on what works best. However, we do get inquiries and questions frequently through our webpage contact info. Lion Tom's use of print media (Vienna Voice) is probably very effective in getting info out.

#### Manassas Host Food Drive

The Manassas Host Club holds two food drives each year. Normally we hold one on the Saturday before the Super Bowl but the threat of bad weather postponed it this year to the following Saturday, February 15th. Mother Nature did not fully cooperate that day with cold and rain but we persevered and were out for six hours collecting food and monetary donations to support four local food banks. In our past Food Drives, the record was 90 boxes and \$398 in cash and gift cards. We now have now a new record of 97 boxes as well as \$448 in donations. This translates to about 1.500 pounds of food. Eleven members helped with the collection. Kudos to the lead, Lion Ed Slevin and to Lions Robert Bass and President Keith Garrett (pictured) for their skills in packing boxes with a variety of items so they were ready to distribute to those in need.


Some Lion's couples celebrated St Patricks Day at the American Legion Post 176's dinner event. From the photos, it's not clear <u>everyone</u> wore green!


